## Questions for Genesis:

The Generations of Adam (4:25-5:32)

<sup>NAS</sup> **Genesis 4:25** And Adam had relations with his wife again; and she gave birth to a son, and named him Seth, for, *she said*, "God has appointed me another offspring in place of Abel; for Cain killed him." <sup>26</sup> And to Seth, to him also a son was born; and he called his name Enosh. Then *men* began to call upon the name of the LORD. **5:1** This is the book of the generations of Adam. In the day when God created man, He made him in the likeness of God. <sup>2</sup> He created them male and female, and He blessed them and named them Man in the day when they were created. <sup>3</sup> When Adam had lived one hundred and thirty years, he became the father of *a son* in his own likeness, according to his image, and named him Seth. <sup>4</sup> Then the days of Adam after he became the father of Seth were eight hundred years, and he had *other* sons and daughters. <sup>5</sup> So all the days that Adam lived were nine hundred and thirty years, and he died. <sup>6</sup> And Seth lived one hundred and five years, and became the father of Enosh. <sup>7</sup> Then Seth lived eight hundred and seven years after he became the father of Enosh, and he had *other* sons and daughters. <sup>8</sup> So all the days of Seth were nine hundred and twelve years, and he died. <sup>9</sup> And Enosh lived ninety years, and became the father of Kenan. <sup>10</sup> Then Enosh lived eight hundred and fifteen years after he became the father of Kenan, and he had *other* sons and daughters. <sup>11</sup> So all the days of Enosh were nine hundred and five years, and he died. <sup>12</sup> And Kenan lived seventy years, and became the father of Mahalalel. <sup>13</sup> Then Kenan lived eight hundred and forty years after he became the father of Mahalalel, and he had *other* sons and daughters. <sup>14</sup> So all the days of Kenan were nine hundred and ten years, and he died. <sup>15</sup> And Mahalalel lived sixty-five years, and became the father of Jared. <sup>16</sup> Then Mahalalel lived eight hundred and thirty years after he became the father of Jared, and he had *other* sons and daughters. <sup>17</sup> So all the days of Mahalalel were eight hundred and ninety-five years, and he died. <sup>18</sup> And Jared lived one hundred and sixty-two years, and became the father of Enoch. <sup>19</sup> Then Jared lived eight hundred years after he became the father of Enoch, and he had *other* sons and daughters. <sup>20</sup> So all the days of Jared were nine hundred and sixty-two years, and he died. <sup>21</sup> And Enoch lived sixty-five years, and became the father of Methuselah. <sup>22</sup> Then Enoch walked with God three hundred years after he became the father of Methuselah, and he had *other* sons and daughters. <sup>23</sup> So all the days of Enoch were three hundred and sixty-five years. <sup>24</sup> And Enoch walked with God; and he was not, for God took him. <sup>25</sup> And Methuselah lived one hundred and eighty-seven years, and became the father of Lamech. <sup>26</sup> Then Methuselah lived seven hundred and eighty-two years after he became the father of Lamech, and he had *other* sons and daughters. <sup>27</sup> So all the days of Methuselah were nine hundred and sixty-nine years, and he died. <sup>28</sup> And Lamech lived one hundred and eighty-two years, and became the father of a son. <sup>29</sup> Now he called his name Noah, saying, "This one shall give us rest from our work and from the toil of our hands *arising* from the ground which the LORD has cursed." <sup>30</sup> Then Lamech lived five hundred

and ninety-five years after he became the father of Noah, and he had *other* sons and daughters. <sup>31</sup> So all the days of Lamech were seven hundred and seventy-seven years, and he died. <sup>32</sup> And Noah was five hundred years old, and Noah became the father of Shem, Ham, and Japheth.

5. As you write out the genealogy, what important facts jump out at you?
6. What does this portion of scripture reveal about the character of God?

7. What do you know about each person listed on the genealogy?
8. What do you learn regarding God's dealing with man from this section of scripture?
9. What are some possible ways that you can use this passage to provide encouragement for another?
10. In what ways does this passage minister to you personally? Explain.
